
Student Demographics

Required Non-QM Training

- “Teaching with Canvas” Course
 - Three Weeks; 100% Online
 - Focuses on using the tools within Canvas: modules, assignments, quizzes, grading, and more.
 - Facilitated by department Instructional Designers
- “Overview of Online Instruction” Course
 - Eight Weeks; 100% Online
 - “An introduction to online learning and instruction in which key aspects of adaptation to the online environment, course facilitation, and relevant designs are previewed.”



Required QM Training

- Started in 2015 as an optional training opportunity.
- In 2016 changed to requiring APPQMR workshop within One Year of faculty member beginning to teach online.
- **At a Glance:**
 - Individuals Trained: 151
 - Peer Reviewers: 2 (has been up to 4)
 - Master Reviewers: 1
 - Facilitators: 1
 - Courses Submitted for Review/Re-Review: 9 (all have met standards)
 - 2 Reviews Currently in Progress

Pros of Required APPQMR

- Introduction to Quality Matters
- ‘Understanding’ Objectives/Alignment
 - Faculty: many from industry and not formal teaching programs/backgrounds
- Starting a discussion - - - QM Vocabulary
- Cost: Facilitation
- Materials/Rubric Workbook in front of faculty
- Model Good Course Design
- Apply Rubric/Standards to Own Course (Informal Review)



Cons of Required APPQMR

- Mandate from High
 - Less Organic
 - Less Initial By-In
- Cost: Materials and Online Fee
- Time/Staffing
- No Correlation in Completion and Courses Submitted for Official QM Reviews
