



Consortium Challenges

- Moving from internal reviews to official QM reviews
 - *What is stopping institutions from doing them?*
 - *What is stopping faculty and staff from becoming reviewers?*
 - *Institutions have a high numbers of bartering credits, but are not using them.*
- Need for Master Reviewers
 - *Burnout?*
 - *Not updating their role?*
- *Where quality assurance “fits” in member institutions?*

Two-year public community college

Strengths & Challenges | Sinclair

Strengths

- ★ All eLearning Division staff are QM Trained (APPQMR and/or Peer Reviewers)
 - Dedicated position
- ★ QM principles are embedded in master templates, course design and internal course review processes (home-grown format)
- ★ Culture of quality - *no one argues quality is the goal!*

Challenges

- Getting faculty to attend APPQMR (or any training currently)
- Garnering interest in official course reviews

How QM Ohio Impacts Sinclair

First joined in 2009; ramped up again in 2016 to now

- Training/Professional Development
 - Opportunities to attend and present
- Bartered Reviews
 - Saves money!
 - Opportunities for institutional reviewers
- Communication and Collaboration - Not alone!
 - Share ideas
 - Share resources

Who We Are | The University of Akron

- 770 Fully Online Sections (Fall 2023)
- Serving 15,840 online enrollments (duplicated)
- 31% of all credit hours delivered each semester come from online enrollments

- 48 QM-Recognized Courses (2012-2023)
- 245 APPQMR Completers
- 6 Master Reviewers, 15 Peer Reviewers
- Team 6 staff
(4 Senior IDs and 2 Multimedia Developers)



The University of Akron - Strengths/Challenges

Strengths

- Well established process for delivering professional development to faculty
 - 3 LMS Trainings with progressively more advanced tools in each one
 - “Designing Your Online Course Workshop) with over 200 faculty completing pedagogical / technical training:
(8-10 sessions over a month, w/ 20-30 faculty)
- Use of LMS Template that is aligned to the QM Rubric
- Created “The UAkron Online Promise” as an easy on-ramp to QM

Challenges

- Administrative Buy-In
- “Initiative Burnout”
- Perception that QM is just too difficult
- Compensation for time invested
- Consideration of work on reviews counting towards promotion & tenure

How QM Ohio Impacts UA

- Taking advantage of free professional development
 - QM Ohio Webinars, Annual Member Meeting
 - Certifications that faculty are seeking as a way of building momentum
 - Great to advertise things constantly on our PD calendar
- Bartering Reviews
 - UA has not paid for a review in 7 years! This is a huge deal given the budgetary constraints
- Network of Peers
 - We have conversations on implementation, LMS questions, review requests, unofficial mentoring

Who We Are | Walsh University

- Private, Catholic 4-year Institution: North Canton, OH
 - Founded by the Brothers of Christian Instruction in 1960
- Liberal Arts Curriculum
- 2,309 Students, Fall '23
- 65+ undergraduate majors
- 7 graduate degree programs
- 916 students enrolled in at least one online course, AY 22-23
 - 182 students enrolled exclusively in online courses, AY 22-23
- Global Learning/Partnership in 7 countries
 - Ireland, Austria, Italy, Australia, Iraq, & Brazil



Strengths & Challenges | Walsh University

Strengths

- Course shell and syllabus template align with QM standards
- QM Momentum: 3 courses were certified last year
 - 10 courses certified since 2020
- APPQMR (29), PRC (7), MRC (1), TOC (1), QMCT (2)
- Faculty involvement by hosting 2023 QM Ohio Annual Meeting

Challenges

- Faculty to complete QM Professional Development (APPQMR)
- Full day course is difficult to attend during the 8 week teaching term
- New action plan:
 - Plan PD during holiday/summer breaks: easier for faculty
 - Reconsider if IYOC is better for some to take first before APPQMR

QM Implementation | Walsh University

Center for Academic and Professional Enrichment (CAPE)

- Chair, Academic Excellence Pillar
Seminars/workshops: online course development (QM)

Statewide Conference & Networking

- QM Ohio Annual Member Meeting (AMM)
 - Hosted by Walsh University
 - 20 presentations, 40 presenters
 - 160 attendees from over 20 institutions across Ohio



Future Steps in QM Implementation

- Undergraduate Honors Project
 - 1st Walsh student to work with QM & to design a “course” with university course shell (LMS = Sakai)
- New Faculty PD
 - QM introduced in small chunks
- Long term goal
 - Student publication: showcasing this QM research project



Getting Started

How YOU Can Build Your Own Partnerships

Begin Now! (Get Organized)

- Find list of stakeholders around you (local/regional) and state
- Establish a mechanism of funding. This can be small, but will open up doors for PD, meetings, and branding.
- Establish your mission. → **DOUBLE DOWN ON QUALITY** ←

Next Two Months

- Set up a communication channel (Simple listserv, Discord, Slack)
- Open communication channels among local/regional institutions

Begin Now!

It only takes ONE faculty member who's excited about QM / successful with QM in order to build a platform.

Make the pitch!

Use QM's multi-section policy to target a course that will have a large impact. (Think Gen Ed high-enrollment courses)

Begin Now!


Ask yourself this...

What's the MISSION of your institution? Does quality assurance fit into that mission? We bet it does!


Make the case with some key administrators...


Next Year
