

# How Can Strategic Use of Interactions Help Overcome Barriers in Your Online Course?

## Learner - Content

- Provide a structured entry into learning within your course (strategically consider syllabus, schedule, orientation activities as “content”)
- Provide opportunities for learners to interact/engage with content (active learning) e.g. SoftChalk, Articulate, H5P, Vialogues, EdPuzzle, etc.)
- Provide content in different forms that students can consume in their own way (text, articles, videos, blogs, podcasts, websites, outlines/handouts)
- Think of content creatively

## Learner - Instructor

- Jump start the online community; welcome your learners
- Lessen the learning curve – help orient learners to your course
- Provide essential feedback to students as they learn
- “Pull in” learners who are not engaging / who aren’t keeping up
- Feedback from learners → what needs to be clarified/reviewed
- “Replace” learner-learner interaction (when not appropriate)

## Learner - Learner

- Develop a true online learning community
- Promote engaged learners
- Increase persistence within course (students feel less isolated)
- Provide a guidepost to each other – expectations for quality
- Learners can support each other through their learning experience
